We will be on site at the Claresholm Agriplex and the home phone will not be monitored from Thursday thru Sunday. Call the cell number for any inquires regarding the show from Thursday June 9 – 12:00 pm until the end of the show.

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLE

Equine Canada (EC), the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensure that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continue to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

Competition Rules

- The CC/ADA show will be conducted according to the 2011 EC Rule Book, Section A, General Rules and Section E, Dressage. The show organizers reserve the right to add or amend the rules or decide any point not covered by these rules and to correct any errors or to make any necessary alterations in the rules, prize lists, or program.
- CC/ADA will NOT provide readers. If you wish to have your test read, you are responsible to provide your own reader. All readers must adhere to EC rules and dress code for readers as outlined in EC rules Section E rule 9.1
- The Gate will remain open for all tests in all arenas(except where noted).
- All tests will be ridden in a 20 x 60 meter ring.
- Both show arenas are closed after the commencement of the first class of the show per EC regulation (E7.12.1). Competitors will be notified prior to the show of schooling ring regulations and times.
- Lungeing is not permitted in an area where horses are being ridden. (E7.16.6) Show organizers are not obliged to provide a lungeing area (E7.16.7)
- Juniors: "Individuals are considered juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18 years of age." (E3.4.3.1)
- Junior competitors must wear properly fitted, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured at all times while mounted or riding on a horse-drawn vehicle on the competition or event grounds. Approved headgear must be certified by SEI or the American Society for Testing Materials (ASTM) standard or the British Standards Institution (BSI) standard. (A905.2)
 - a) This ruling applies at all EC-sanctioned competitions.
 - b) Juniors not complying with this rule will not be allowed to compete in competitions that require approved headgear.
- The Equine Medication Control testing fee for 2011 is \$7.00.
- Any horse entered in any class at a competition, while on the competition grounds, may be selected for equine medication control testing. (A602.5).
- Riders must report, still mounted, to the steward or representative for a tack check immediately upon leaving the competition arena. The rider may not remove any equipment or clothing before the steward has conducted their check. (E4.16).
- Bridle numbers must be clearly visible to the judge at all times. They may be placed on the breast collar at the center of the horses' chest, on both sides of the bridle at the brow band, or attached to the saddle pad on both sides. They must either be the CC/ADA issued numbers, or if using your own the actual number must be a minimum of 2" in height.
- It is mandatory for the horse's competition number to be worn by the horse or rider/handler at any time that the horse is not in its stall, from the time the number is issued to the end of the competition to identify the horse. Failure to comply will result in a warning for the first offense and possible elimination or disqualification for subsequent offenses (E 7.11.2).
- Dressage Dress, Saddlery and Equipment regulations are covered in Section E Chapter 4 of EC Rules.
- Warm-up is only permitted in the designated arena, east of the indoor arena, on the Claresholm Agriplex grounds. Use of any other area will be at the user's own risk, but is still subject to EC Stewarding Regulations.
- Horses must be put in assigned stalls and the stable area must be kept clean at all times and all aisles unobstructed. This is a requirement of the Claresholm Agriplex for Fire Regulations. Braiding, grooming and tacking up must be done in the stall. All hay, tack trucks, etc. **MUST** be stored out of the alleyway. The barns will be checked periodically through the weekend. Anything left in the alleyways (except morning feed) will be removed.
- The Agriplex show grounds are a **NON-SMOKING AREA** and smoking is only permitted in the designated area.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times while on Claresholm Agriplex grounds.

Memberships and Paperwork

- An EC Gold Sport License is mandatory for all exhibitors and horse owners (A203.5).
- Dressage Canada Affiliation is a mandatory requirement for all riders to compete at Dressage Gold Competitions. This affiliation can be purchased from the EC website. It is not available for sale at the show (E3.1).
- Competitors who hold a bronze or silver sport licence, must purchase a single event upgrade to gold level. (Bronze to Gold - \$40.00 Silver to Gold - \$20.00) (A211).
- Temporary Sport Licenses are available for those who do not hold an EC sport license (\$65.00). Points are not tabulated for temporary sport license holders.(See entry form) (A208).
- An eligible Temporary Sport License holder may compete in amateur classes provided an Amateur Affidavit has been completed and is on file with the competition secretary (A208.4).
- Exhibitors and horse owners who are residents of “EC participating provinces” (BC, MB, NB, ON and YK), must provide a photocopy of their PSO (Provincial Sport Organization) membership card.
- Passports are mandatory and must be turned in to the show office before the horse will be permitted to compete. A valid 2011 horse license sticker must accompany all passports. (A402.1).
- Temporary Horse Registrations are available for those who do not hold Horse Passports, (\$45.00). Points will not be tabulated for holders of temporary horse registrations. (A.411.3).
- A photocopy of your (and owner, if applicable) EC sport Licence with DC Affiliate, EC Horse licence sticker, and PSO membership card (if applicable), must accompany your entry form. If you do not hold these memberships, please purchase temporary memberships on your entry form.
- If you have applied for these required documents, but have not yet received them, you must provide proof from the association that your application has been received, or you must purchase temporary memberships.
- Chinook Country/ADA members will be entitled to a \$25.00 discount. You must be a member, in good standing by March 1, 2011.

Legalities

- The CC/ADA requires that all persons connected with entries be familiar with the 2011 EC Rules – Section A, General Rules, Section E, Dressage Rules and the contents of this prize list.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to limit or refuse entries, split, cancel or combine, and/or adjust any class at its discretion. The Show Committee also reserves the right to remove any horse and/or rider from the competition without being liable for compensation (A603.2).
- The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone who is in financial arrears from past shows (A805.3).
- CC/ADA, The Claesholm Agriplex, EC, Show Officials or Show Volunteers will not be responsible in any way for damages, losses, theft, or accidents, etc. that may occur to any entry, owner, competitor, volunteer, or spectator during the show.
- Any protests must be in writing, accompanied by a deposit of \$100.00 cash, and addressed to the Show Secretary of the competition within 48 hours of completion of the class concerned (A1206).

For your information

- Horses will be accepted onto the show grounds after 12:00 pm Friday, June 10, 2011.
- **Stabling requests:** If you are coming with a group, please agree on a Group/Stable name to be used by all participants on their entry form. The group will be assigned the number of stalls required. We do not assign stalls to individuals within the group so please do not list friends names that you want to be near within your Group/Stable.
- If you wish to be stabled with one or two other friends (not with a Group/Stable), list all of the people who wish to be together, you will be assigned the number of stalls needed, and it will be up to you to select the stall you want within that assignment.
- Wherever possible, stallions will be accommodated; however, we cannot guarantee that complete isolation of a stallion will be possible. We can accept a maximum of 6 stallions.
- Shared tack stalls will be assigned at no charge. The Show Committee will assign tack stalls as part of the stabling procedure. All competitors must use only their assigned stalls and tack stalls. Use of unassigned stalls will result in a charge back to the entrant.
- There are no day stalls available at the show grounds. All competitors must pay for, and will be assigned a stall for the full duration of the show.
- Horses may be tied to horse trailers for tack up purposes only, however, the trailer must be attached to a towing vehicle, and horses must not be left unattended.
- The Claresholm Agriplex provides shavings only. A wheelbarrow is available for use by the competitors to add more shavings to the stall if required.
- Please bring your own water buckets as there is no automatic watering system in the barns.
- Please bring your own hay. There is none available to purchase.
- RV hook-ups (power only) are available on a first come first serve basis at 10.00 per night. Please indicate on your entry form, if you, a friend or family member, will require an RV spot (2 days if you are arriving on Friday, 1 day if you are arriving on Saturday AM).
- All horses must vacate the Agriplex grounds by Sunday June 12, 2011, 8:00 PM.
- The wash bay, in the west end of the indoor arena is open to competitors except during scheduled show times. The access doors to the wash bay will be locked during competition.
- Mandatory Deposit: Each entrant is required to pay a \$50.00 Deposit on a separate cheque. This deposit is refundable when all outstanding amounts are paid and on **return of bridle numbers** at the end of the show.
- Riders wishing to school horses at the show without entering classes will be accepted only if extra stabling is available after show entries are accommodated (approximately 1 week after closing date). Non-competing entries must complete an entry form, will be assigned a bridle number and will be subject to all EC and competition regulations. Full stabling and accessorial fees are still required but these entries are not eligible for the CC/ADA discount. The EC Drug testing, and DC levy are not assessed on non-competing entries. An EC Gold Sport License is required for the rider and owner, and a valid horse passport is required. All exhibitors and horse owners who are members of "EC participating provinces" (BC, MB, NB, ON and YK), must include a copy of their PSO membership card.
- Hors Concours (the ride is scored by the judge, but is not placed in the class, nor can scores be used for prizes or awards) entries will be accepted. Such entries must pay the full entry fee and are subject to all EC and competition regulations (E7.11.12).

The Classes

- Any horse receiving less than 40% of the total marks obtainable in a test will be eliminated from that class (E9.10.8) and any horse receiving less than 50% in any class shall not be eligible for awards (E9.10.7).
- Miscellaneous “Let’s get Rockin’” Class. These classes will be offered as Junior and Adult classes and will run as walk/trot/canter group classes (Canter as a group will be at the judge’s discretion). A class may be split, depending on entry numbers. This class is designed to give (new, nervous) riders and (young, nervous or first time) horses more exposure to the indoor arena prior to their tests. The gate will be closed for this class. Once the gate is closed, no more horses may enter the arena. This class will be held as the first class on Saturday and Sunday morning prior to commencement of regular competition (consult the bulletin board Friday and Saturday night for start times). This class is NOT rated for EC Awards. Post entries are permitted for this class. (A503)
- Freestyle music must be submitted in 2 functional copies in standard CD playable format. (E10.4)
- Freestyle Eligibility: A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 55% in a dressage test at the same technical level, or higher, as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 55% in First or Second Level to compete in the First Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition, or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. (E 10.6.1)
- Freestyles are limited to 5 minutes in length.

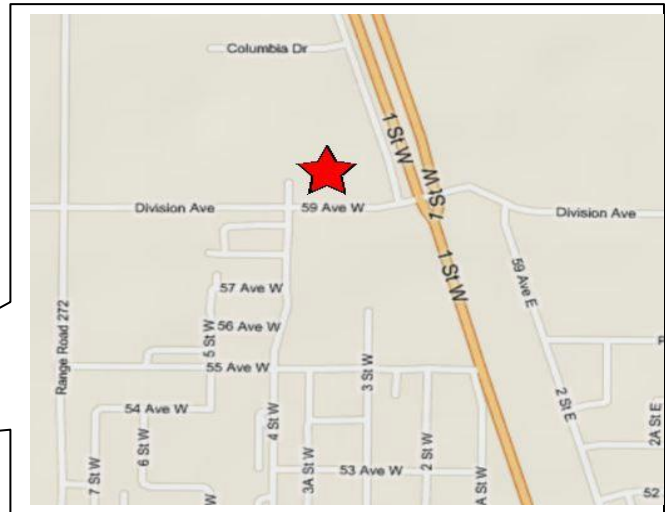
Prizes and Awards

- Class Prizes and Prize money will be distributed according to sponsor support. These prizes may be picked up at the show office, no sooner than ½ hour after completion of the class.
- There will be Champion and Reserve awards for all levels/divisions (except FEI Young Horse and Materiale classes). However, the Show Committee reserves the right to combine levels/divisions, based on sponsorship support.
- Level/Division Champion and Reserve awards will be determined by totaling your best 2 scores in a level/division (E9.11.4). Freestyle and Non-EC class scores do not count toward level/division Championship or Reserve awards.
- All level/division Champion and Reserve awards will be announced on completion of the level/division. Prizes may be picked up at the show office. All Champion and Reserve recipients will be asked to make arrangements with the show photographer for a photo session with you and your horse **in show attire**. The photo you select will be presented to the class sponsor(s).
- Freestyle Champion and Reserve awards will be presented following the freestyle classes. Recipients must be mounted and in competition attire. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- Show Champion coolers and special awards will be presented Sunday after the last class of the show.

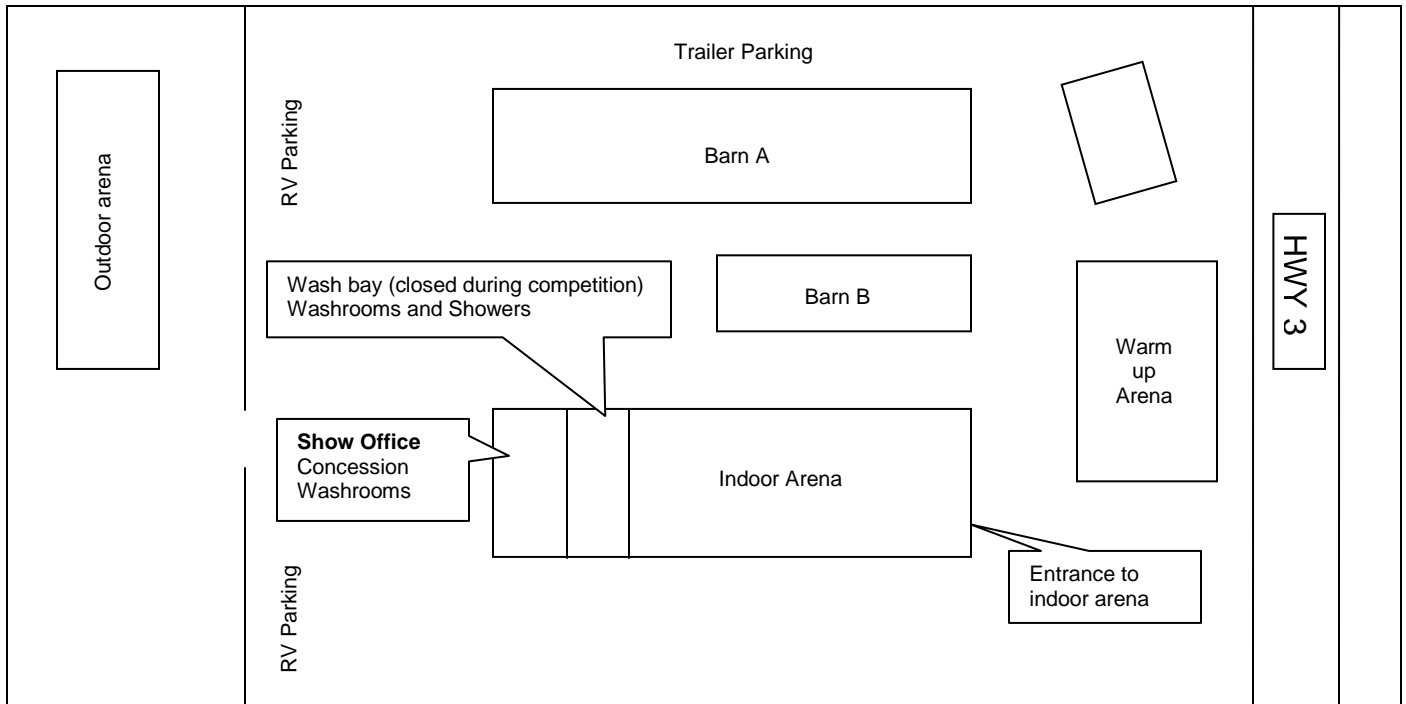
The Agriplex is located on the north end of Claresholm, on the west side of the #2 Highway. Turn west on 59 Ave W. (Also known as Division Avenue).

Award Ceremony

The Award Ceremony will be held Sunday on completion of all classes. The following presentations will be made at this ceremony:

**If Show Champion winners are not on the grounds for awards they forfeit the prize.
It will then be given to next person in line.**

2011 SHOW CHAMPIONS

Show Champion Criteria

Show Championship Coolers will be awarded for Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open Status.

For Show championships/reserve only:

“Junior” will consist of EC Junior Training: Junior 1st level; and FEI Pony, Child, and Junior Divisions

“Adult Amateur” will consist of AA’s competing in EC Training and First Level.

“Open” will consist of all Open riders competing In EC Training through 4th Level, FEI Young Riders, and Advanced Divisions.

The tests must be within a single level or division.

Awards will be calculated by adding the 2 best scores from your technical test marks
Show Champion will be awarded to the highest total, reserve to the second highest total.

(Freestyle, Non-EC class, FEI Young Horse and EC Materiale scores are not eligible for show champion)

If Show Champion/Reserve winners are not on the grounds for awards they forfeit the prize.

It will then be given to next competitor in line.

SPECIAL AWARDS

Sid Green Memorial Sportsmanship Award:

To be presented to anyone (including riders, owners, grooms, volunteers, friends, family, or spectators) who has demonstrated extraordinary sportsmanship during the show.

Donna Morgan Memorial Award:

This award is in memory of Donna Morgan who passed away March 28, 2007 after a short battle with pancreatic cancer. She was an active member and treasurer of CC/ADA for a number of years. She was very involved with the Junior/Young Riders/ADA while her daughter Ashley was riding in their program. The following are the criteria for this award:

- ✓ Rider must be an Adult Amateur according to the EC Dressage Rulebook
- ✓ 40 years of age or older as of the first day of the 2010 CC/ADA Summer Dressage Show
- ✓ Awarded to the rider with the highest single score of the show including freestyle
- ✓ **Riders must register** on their entry form or at the show office by 6:00pm Saturday, June 11, 2011.

Other awards based on sponsor support.

Entry Information

- There will be a limit of 80 horses with valid, fully paid entries.

- **Entry Criteria**

Entries will be considered valid once all of the following are received:

- a. Entry form complete (must be legible).
- b. Liability form completed, all bullets initialed, signed and witnessed.
- c. Photocopies of EC card for rider (with DC affiliate) and owner if applicable, 2011 horse license sticker.
- d. Photocopy of Rider and owner PSO membership card, if they are residents of EC Participating Provinces (BC, MB, NB, ON and YK).
- e. Full payment of entry fees and accessorial fee.
- f. Post-marked by Canada Post or Courier on or before May 9, 2011.

Entry numbers will only be assigned to valid entries. An entry confirmation will be issued by the CC/ADA for all complete and valid entries and will be emailed or mailed via Canada Post to the rider and owner (if applicable).

- Entries will not be accepted from owners/riders who are not in good standing with any mandatory organization affiliated with this show.
- Entries may be:
 - Mailed or couriered
 - Emailed to the following email address only: deb.rosinsky@shaw.ca and payments mailed or couriered before May 9, 2011
 - Telephone entries **will not** be accepted.

NOTE: Entries will not be considered complete and accepted as valid until all the "entry criteria" as outlined above, are met.

- Entries, and **payment for emailed** entries, must be post-marked by Canada Post or courier no later than midnight May 9, 2011 and paid in full.
- An entry received with a post dated check, will not be accepted as valid, and will not be assigned an entry number, until the date on the check. Likewise, an entry confirmation will not be issued until the entry becomes valid.
- All checks or money orders are to be made payable to: CHINOOK COUNTRY/ADA or CC/ADA. Credit cards will not be accepted. A \$45.00 NSF fee will be charged for any NSF checks.
- Changes and cancellations can be made, with no penalty, up to the show closing date.
- Late entries will be considered, based on entry levels, and at the discretion of the Show Committee. There will be an additional \$30.00 late fee if the late entry is accepted.
- Changes to entries after the closing date, but before May 27th will be subject to a change fee of \$10.00 per change. Changes on or after May 28th will require Show Committee approval and will be subject to a fee of \$20.00 per change.
- There will be no refund of entry fees after the official entry closing date of the show except with a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate, which must be received in hard copy within 15 days of emailed or telephoned notification. In the case of a vet/med out, refunds will be made, in part or in full, at the show committee's discretion, and within EC CAP guidelines. There will be no refund of entries for **any** reason after the first class of the show starts.
- Overpayment of show fees will be considered a donation to the show, at the Committee's discretion.
- In the event of curtailment, postponement or cancellation of the show due to weather, health or disaster conditions, refunds may be made in part or in full at the show committee's discretion and within EC CAP guidelines.
- The Class Schedule will be posted on the ADA website on June 6, 2011:

- The tentative riding schedule will be posted on the ADA website on June 6, 2011, but may need adjustment, therefore, there will be day sheets published on Friday evening for Saturday ride times, and Saturday evening for Sunday riding times. Please check the day sheets the evening prior to confirm your ride times. **The published day sheets will be considered official ride times.**
- Stall and shared tack stall assignments will be available Friday, 12:00 pm June 10, 2011. You must use the stall assigned. There will be no changing of stalls without the consent of the Show Manager. **Any** use of unassigned stalls will result in a charge back to the entrant. If you must arrive prior to Friday 12:00 noon, please contact the Entry Coordinator as there will be additional costs for stabling.
- Post entries will only be accepted for the Let's Get Rockin' classes.
- Horse substitutions will be subject to approval by the show committee. There will be a fee of \$30.00 per substitution.
