**III. SPECIFIC TECHNICAL CONDITIONS**

**1. VENUE:**

The Dressage and Jumping events will take place outdoors; the Reining events will take place indoors.

**2. COMPETITION ARENAS**

**Dressage**

Sand; arena dimensions: 20 x 60 m

**Jumping**

Sand; arena dimensions: 75 x 90 m

**Reining**

Sand; arena dimensions: 22 x 65 m

**3. PRACTICE ARENA**

## IV. INVITATIONS

### 1. General

Competitors are invited by the Organizing Committee through their P/TSO. All Team members must be 2011 Members in Good Standing of their respective provincial equestrian federation /association. This includes athletes, coaches, grooms, Chef d'Équipe and any other member involved with the team.

All Provincial/Territorial Federations of Canada, total of 11, are invited to enter the Canadian Equestrian Championships.

### 2. Junior and Senior age groups

**Junior:** A competitor is considered a Junior who is 17 years of age and under as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 (must be born in 1993 or after).

**Senior:** A competitor is considered a Senior who is 18 years of age and over as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 (must be born in 1992 or before).

### 3. Team size

Each provincial or territorial discipline team must be composed of a minimum of 2 riders and a maximum of 4 riders. For teams of 2 riders, one must be a junior and one must be a senior. For teams of 3 riders, at least one must be a junior and at least one must be a senior. For teams of 4 riders, two must be juniors and two must be seniors.

#### 1. Dressage Championships

- Junior competitors will compete at First Level Tests 2 & 3 and Test 3 for a second time.
- Senior competitors will compete at First Level Tests 2 & 3 and Test 3 for a second time.

#### Team championship:

- The top junior score and the top senior score for each team will count towards the team championship.

#### Individual championships:

- Junior individual scores from all three classes will count towards the junior individual championship.
- Senior individual scores from all three classes will count towards the senior individual championship.

#### Tie Break Procedures

**Individual** - The winner is the horse/rider combination having the highest total points; Second place is the horse/rider combination with the next highest total points and so on. In the case of equality of points, the horse/rider combination with the highest total of collective marks shall be declared the winner. If the collective marks are tied, it comes down to the # of first place (or highest number of 1<sup>st</sup> place) finishes, followed, if needed, by the # of 2<sup>nd</sup> place finishes.

**Team:** The winning team is the team with the highest combined total points. Second place is the team with the next highest total points and so on. In the case of equality of points, the team with the highest total of collective marks shall be declared the winner. If the collective marks are tied, it comes down to the # of first place (or highest number of 1<sup>st</sup> place) finishes, followed, if needed, by the # of 2<sup>nd</sup> place finishes.

#### **Eligibility:**

A Junior Rider may not compete in these Championships if he/she has competed at the Dressage Championships for Juniors or Young Riders at the NAYRC. Junior riders must not have competed above the second level in 2011 in order to be eligible.

A Senior Rider may not compete in these Championships if he/she has competed at the Dressage Championships for Juniors or Young Riders at the NAYRC. Senior riders must not have competed above the second level in 2011 in order to be eligible.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR EXHIBITORS ONLY.

## 5. JUMPING CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Junior Competitors will compete at the 1.1 m level.
- Senior competitors will compete at the 1.1 m level.

Note: All Championship classes will be scored as per FEI Article 238 2.2 Table "A". Note: All times will be scored to the third decimal point.

#### Team championship:

- The top junior score and the top senior score from each of the 3 championship classes for each team will count towards the team championship.

#### Individual championships:

- Junior individual scores from each of the 3 championship classes for each team will count towards the junior individual championship.
- Senior individual scores from each of the 3 championship classes for each team will count towards the senior individual championship.

#### **Tie Breaking Procedures**

In the event that there is a tie for first place in the team championships, there will be a jump-off. The Chef d'Équipes will choose a member from his/her team to represent that team in a second jump-off. The course will be a shortened course at the (1.1m) height, against the clock.

#### **Eligibility:**

A Competitor may not compete in these Championships if he/she has competed at the Jumping Championships for Juniors or Young Riders at the NAYRC. Competitors must not have competed above the 1.2 m level in 2011 in order to be eligible.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR EXHIBITORS ONLY.

#### **6. REINING CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- Junior competitors will ride NRHA's Reining patterns #5, #8, and pattern #10.
- Senior competitors will ride NRHA's Reining patterns #5, #8, and pattern #10.

#### Team championship:

- The top junior score and the top senior score from each of the three championship classes for each team will count towards the team championship.

#### Individual championships:

- The sum of Junior individual scores from ALL three classes (patterns #5, #8 and #10) will count towards the junior individual championship.
- Senior individual scores from the regular championship classes (patterns #5, #8 and #10) will count towards the senior individual championship.

#### Tie Breaking Procedures

If a tie should occur, the top three rider/horse combinations will be determined by:

1. The athlete with the greatest number of 1st placings, if still tied
2. The athlete with the greatest number of 2nd placings, if still tied
3. The athlete with the greatest number of 3rd placings, if still tied,
4. Awards will be presented to both athletes involved in the tie breaker.

#### **Eligibility:**

A Junior Rider may not compete in these Championships if he/she has competed at the Reining Championships for Juniors or Young Riders at the NAYRC. Junior competitors must have obtained at least the score of 65 at a minimum of one competition in 2011.

A Senior Rider may not compete in these Championships if he/she has competed at the Reining Championships for Juniors or Young Riders at the NAYRC. Senior riders whose names appear on the NRHA 2011 ineligibility lists as a Limited Non-Pro or Rookie Pro are not eligible to compete. Competitors must have obtained at least the score of 65 at a minimum of one competition in 2011.

Stallions may be shown by SENIOR EXHIBITORS ONLY.

#### **7. Number of horses**

A rider may only ride one horse in any class at this event.

### 2. Grooms

Housing will be at the expense of the participants including competitors, chefs and groom. They must make their own reservations and payment for housing.

Meals - September 15<sup>th</sup> - 18<sup>th</sup>, food service will be available for purchase on the show ground for breakfast, lunch and dinner.

### 3. Horses

Transportation expenses will be at the expense of the participants.

Stabling will be on the site in 10' x 10' temporary stalls.

Stabling will be offered free of charge to participants (except for early arrivals, see stabling form).

Participants will supply their own buckets for feed and water. See IX # 13 for more information.

Stabling services will be available starting **September 14th 2011**, through the morning of **September 19th 2011**. In addition, stabling includes one tack/feed stall for every team (4 horses). Bedding will be available for purchase.

## **LEASING of HORSES**

The organizing committee will make every attempt to provide leased horses for all provinces with the exception of Quebec, and its bordering provinces of Ontario and New Brunswick.

The cost for each leased horse is \$1,200.00. This will cover transportation of the horse to and from the competition, feed, stabling and bedding.

PSO's are required to inform the Organizing Committee no later than **June 1 2011**, if said PSO will be leasing horses for this competition.

**FANS, WATER HEATERS AND REFRIGERATORS:** Due to the nature of tent stabling, electricity for bucket heaters and refrigerators cannot be provided. **Only one electric fan per two stalls will be permitted. No other electrical devices, refrigerators, etc. are allowed in the stable area.**

### **4. Arrival Time/Date**

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them upon their arrival.

**5. Local Transportation** – shuttle service from hotel to competition grounds will be available.

### **6. Advertising and publicity on competitors and horses**

The competitors are authorized to carry the logo of their personal sponsor their on the saddle pad.

## **VII. ENTRIES**

### **1. ENTRY FORMS**

All entries must be sent in three phases, through the appropriate Provincial/Territorial Federations.

All competitors must be members of their Provincial/Territorial Federation.

On this form horses must be allocated to the competitors. This is the final selection of competitors and horses that will travel to the event. **All must come from the Nominated Entries list.** Provinces unable to field complete teams may combine individuals only if authorized by their P/TSO and only if declared on the definite entry. **Combined teams will not be accepted after definite entries.** A brief listing of accomplishments as well as local newspaper information is to be included on entry.

**All entries are to be signed by the P/TSO.**

## 2. Summary of Fees

The fees must accompany entry forms as follows:

Definite Entry: **\$100** per provincial/territorial discipline team  
Stable forms must accompany Definite Entries form "C".

Additional tack/feed stalls: **\$180** will be charged plus applicable taxes for additional tack stalls.

Early arrival: from September 12<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> at a cost of **\$50** per day charged in addition to applicable local taxes.

Random drug testing: Random drug testing fee: A **\$6** fee per horse will be charged.

### 2. HEALTH RECORDS/VACCINATION/COGGINS TEST

#### Equine Influenza Vaccination

All horses and ponies must have a vaccination certificate endorsed by a veterinarian, who is not the owner of the animal, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 12 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

**Coggins Test and Health Certificate** A valid Coggins test not more than 6 months old must accompany each horse. No horses will be permitted into the stabling area unless examined by a member of the Veterinary staff or stable manager.

## IX. MISCELLANEOUS

### 1. Objections/Complaints

All complaints and objections to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100.

### 2. Awards/Championships

**The Canadian Equestrian Championships** will declare a champion team and individual among all participating Provinces/Territories.

Closing Ceremonies and Awards

The Closing Ceremonies will be for the awarding of the Gold, Silver and Bronze medals to the three Championship disciplines. All other awards or prizes will be awarded as close to the end of each class or competition as possible.

The OC Committee invites and expects all participants from the Championship to participate in the Closing Ceremonies. All competitors must be dressed in riding attire appropriate to their discipline for closing ceremonies. Competitors that are not receiving awards at this ceremony are expected to attend to honour and celebrate the achievements of the medalists.

#### **AWARDS:**

Winning Team: All Around Championship Team Title will be presented to the PTA who has accumulated the most overall team championship points (medals won) in all three disciplines.

Winning Dressage Team, Championship Cup  
Winning Junior Dressage Individual, Championship Plate  
Winning Senior Dressage Individual, Championship Plate

Winning Jumper Team, Championship Cup  
Winning Senior Jumper Individual, Championship Plate  
Winning Senior Jumper Individual, Championship Plate

Winning Reining Team, Championship Cup  
Winning Junior Reining Individual, Championship Plate  
Winning Senior Reining Individual, Championship Plate

In each of the classes, ribbons will be presented to the 10<sup>th</sup> place.

In the Team Championships, medals and ribbons will be presented for each of the competitors in the teams taking the first three places.

In the Individual Championships, medals and ribbons will be presented to each of the competitors winning the first three places.

### **3. Medical Team. Veterinarian, Farrier**

#### **Attending Veterinarians:**

**Medical team:** A Medical team will be in attendance for the duration of the Event. Medical team coordinator: TBA.

**Farrier:** Farriers will be in attendance September 15-18, 2011. Regular fees will be charged. A schedule will be posted. All fees must be paid or arrangements made prior to departure of the horse from the grounds.

Owners and riders will be responsible for expenses related to medical, veterinary or farrier services.

#### **4. Insurance**

Neither the Canadian Association of Horse Organizations, the Canadian Equestrian Championships, the Fédération équestre du Québec, the Société d'Agriculture du Comté de Shefford or the Parc Équestre Olympique de Bromont, the employees, volunteers and members of the organizing committee, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, attendants spectators or any property or person whatsoever.

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents and their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

All competitors are required to sign a waiver of Risk and Liability. This form must be submitted by the PTA with Definite Entries Form.

#### **5. Event Organization**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Chefs d'Équipe and Ground Jury, the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes will be notified to all competitors, chefs and officials as soon as possible.

## **6. Entry Right to Competition Grounds**

Horse owners, riders, grooms, official team coaches, individual trainers, team chefs and team veterinarian will be granted free passes to the show grounds.

## **7. Schooling**

Schooling will be permitted in designated areas. The organizing committee will prepare a schooling schedule.

## **8. Safety**

1. FEI approved safety cups are used for the competition.
2. Approved helmets are mandatory for all riders entered in **Jumper** Division
3. All juniors, in **Dressage and Reining**, mounted on a horse must wear approved ASTM/SEI (American Society for Testing Materials/ Safety Equipment Institute) or BSI (British Standards Institution) headgear, with safety harness correctly fastened. It is strongly recommended that all riders wear approved headgear at all times when mounted.

## **9. Stewarding of Stable Area**

**There will be absolutely no smoking or alcoholic beverages permitted in the stable area.**

At least one stable steward, who is directly responsible to the Chief Steward, will be present or readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire duration of the event. He/she may be assisted by deputies, as required. The steward/deputies will regularly patrol the stable area, without establishing any predetermined pattern, to discourage any form of illegal practices or abuses to horses. Any misdemeanors must immediately be reported to the stable steward who must, in turn, report to the Chief Steward.

The duty of the stewards is therefore to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of illegal practices.

## **10. Grooms**

It is appreciated that grooms wish to remain with their horses during the night. Only grooms duly registered with the OC and with the written permission of the Veterinary Commission are permitted to do so.

The person responsible, normally the Chef, must insure that his/her grooms, or any other authorized persons with access to his/her horses, are familiar with the security and stewarding procedures operating at the event attended.

## **11. Stewarding of Practice Arena**

All practice areas will be open only when scheduled and under the supervision of a Steward or their appointed deputy.

## **12. Dogs**

Dogs are welcome at the Bromont Olympic site, but must be leashed at all times. Unleashed dogs will be impounded and owners will be fined as follows: First offense - \$50.00; second offense - \$250.00; third offense - \$500.00. Please do not let your pet/friend/dog ruin a possible championship ride.

Note - Most hotels and accommodations accept dogs.

## **13. Feed/Hay/Bedding/Golf Cart Rental**

Competitors must supply their own hay, feed and bedding. Hay, feed, shavings and golf cart rentals will be available on the grounds. Competitors are urged to order supplies prior to their arrival at [emfrappier@feq.qc.ca](mailto:emfrappier@feq.qc.ca)
