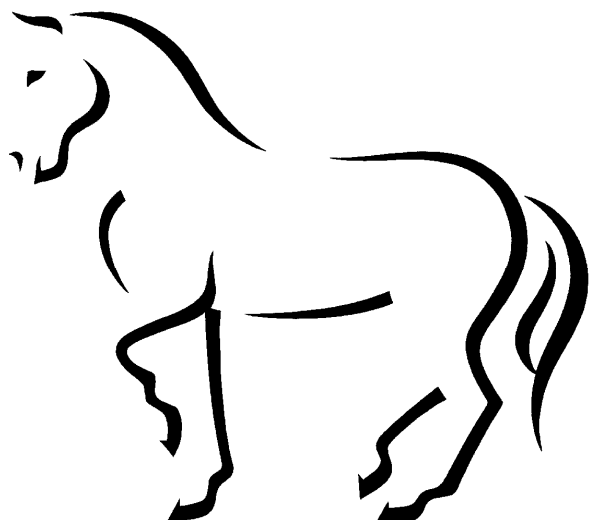

Statement of Principles

EC, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competition;
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

This prize list contains important information regarding scheduling, presentations, entries, qualifications, rules and many other details particular to this show. Please read carefully. You are responsible to know all information contained in this prize list.

ENTRY INFORMATION FOR THE PARKLAND DRESSAGE FESTIVAL

The Parkland Dressage Festival will be running two competitions simultaneously:

1. The Alberta Provincial Championships
2. The Western Regional Championships

The Provincials will be run on Thursday, Friday. The Regionals will be run on Saturday, Sunday. Freestyles will be held Friday and/or Saturday. Horses and riders will ride their freestyle just once and the score can be used for Provincials and Regionals.

There are no qualifying criteria for the Alberta Provincial Championships.

Qualifying criteria for the Western Regional Championships will be a minimum score of 58% for Walk Trot through Fourth level and all FEI divisions. E7.23.12. Scores earned at Silver competitions do not count as qualifying scores for Gold championships. E7.26.2. Scores earned in "Test of Choice" classes cannot be used to qualify for Gold Provincial/Regional/National Championships at any level. You may not use the 2011 Provincial Championships as a qualifier for organizational reasons.

There will be no qualifying scores required for any of the freestyle classes. However, all rider/horse combinations must meet the EC rules of a minimum technical score of 55%. This score can be achieved at any time before the freestyle class including from the 2011 Provincial Championships.

Day sheets will be posted each evening at the scoreboards. Riders are responsible for checking your times each day as changes may be made.

ENTRY REGULATIONS

1. **Entries must be mailed by Aug 26, 2011.** No phone or fax entries.
2. You may send your entry by Express Post. **Absolutely no courier entries will be accepted – there is no delivery to our country address. Any courier entries that need to be picked up will be charged a \$50 handling fee.**
3. An entry is not considered valid until it has been paid in full. No post-dated cheques will be accepted. Cheques and money orders should be made payable to PA/ADA.
4. Absolutely no late entries will be accepted. No entries will be accepted post dated after Aug 26. All entries must be received by Aug 31.
5. No Coggins test is required.
6. Competitors may pay a fee of \$15.00 to compete at a higher level than their license. The single event Sport License upgrade is valid only for that competition.
7. Passports are mandatory and must be turned in to the show office before the horse will be allowed to compete. A valid 2011 horse license must accompany all passports.
8. Hors concours entries will not be accepted.
9. **Non competing horses:** Riders wishing to school horses at the show without entering classes will be required to pay the full stabling fee, the program fee and the compulsory fee. Rider & Owner of the horse must be EC members.
10. The show committee reserves the right to limit entries.
11. After the closing date of Aug 31, refund of **class fees** will be given if a veterinarian or doctor's certificate has been received prior to the start of the show (must be in the show secretary's hands by Wednesday evening). Compulsory fees will not be refunded for any reason after the closing date of Aug 31.
12. "Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing" (A602.5)
13. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with EC rules and regulations.
14. All riders and owners must sign the release and acknowledgment of risk form.

15. Article 4.0: 1. ASTM/SEI or BSI approved headgear must be worn by all riders competing in the following levels: Fourth Level and below, FEI Young Horse Tests, Materiale and Equitation classes at EC Bronze, Silver and Gold competitions. This rule applies whenever the rider is mounted at the competition grounds.
2. ASTM/SEI or BSI approved headgear must be worn by all noncompeting riders mounted on any competing horses at EC Bronze, Silver and Gold competitions.
3. All riders of any age while on non-competing horses must wear protective headgear at all times while mounted at the competition grounds.
4. The penalty for contravening 4.0.1 is elimination.
5. Non-competing riders who contravene 4.0.2 and/or 4.0.3 will be instructed to dismount until wearing an ASTM/SEI or BSI approved helmet.
- Note: At the tack check which follows the test, the steward may ask the rider to dismount so that the helmet may be inspected for the ASTM/SEI or BSI label.
16. All tests must be ridden from memory.
17. **Incomplete entries will not be considered received until complete.** All entries must be paid in full, with validation fee paid or copies of EC cards and received by Aug 31. Please include an email address on your entry so you may receive entry confirmation. You will receive an email confirmation of your entry on or before Sept 10. If your entry does not include photocopies of EC cards for owner & rider, passport number, full payment and the signed waiver it will be considered incomplete and will be held until you complete the entry.
18. Please add carefully – any overpaid amounts of less than \$50 will be considered a donation to the show.

LEVELS AND TESTS

1. Please see EC dressage rules (3.4.4) for definitions of FEI Children, Pony, Junior and Young Riders.
2. No horse may compete in more than two consecutive levels. No horse is to be ridden in more than four classes per day including the freestyle.
3. Cross entering between categories will be allowed but you are expected to ride in both classes. For example, if you enter Adult Amateur First Level and Open First Level you will ride each test twice.
4. A horse may be ridden by more than one rider at the competition but not more than once in a class. The horse must be ridden by the other rider in a different class. Same level, different category or different consecutive levels. See EC rules 7.11.8 for more information.
5. Schooling of horses at Regional and Provincial Championships may be done only by the competing rider from his/her arrival on the show grounds to his/her last class ridden, under penalty of elimination.
6. For details on Materiale classes see the EC dressage rules Chapter 12.
7. If there are fewer than six entries per category the organizing committee has the option to hold only an open category at that level or division.

FREESTYLES

1. Rider/horse combinations competing in more than one level must choose which level freestyle they will ride. FEI Children competitors may compete in the First Level Freestyle.
2. Competitors are not permitted to enter only a freestyle class at a Championships competition.
3. Freestyle music **must be recorded on a CD** and clearly labeled with name and class and any other necessary instructions. Music must be submitted to the show office by the end of classes on Thursday evening. For those wishing an audio check of their music, a testing time will be posted at the show office. We strongly advise that you have a second copy of your CD on hand or submitted to the office.

CHAMPIONSHIPS & AWARDS

1. 7.25.6. Each competitor shall enter and compete in two tests of his/her specific level/division and category (e.g. Junior or Amateur, etc.), The percentages obtained by each competitor in both classes shall be totalled. The competitor with the highest total will be named champion. The competitor with the second highest total shall be declared the reserve champion (providing he/she is in accordance with 7.25.11).
2. Any horse receiving less than 50% on a technical test will not be eligible for any class awards.
3. Freestyle champions will be determined by totaling the higher percentage from the technical classes plus the percentage from the freestyle. Only one freestyle champion will be awarded in each level/division. Freestyle championships will not be awarded by category.
4. Ribbons to 6th place. Prizes and prize money dependent on sponsorship.

RING REGULATIONS

1. Competitors must report to the steward for inspection of tack immediately after completing the test and leaving the arena. Any discrepancy found by the steward and/or failure to report will entail elimination. Any competitor not ready to enter the ring when scheduled will be eliminated.
2. The warm up rings and show rings will be available for schooling on Wednesday starting at 1:00 pm and closing at 9:00 pm. Every effort will be made to also open the rings for schooling on Friday evening however this is very dependent on scheduling. Please check at the show office for details. Be aware that if you are attending only the Saturday and Sunday, you may not have the opportunity to get in the show rings for schooling.
3. Whips may not be carried in Championships. Exception: Dressage Equitation/medal classes (E8.8.7) and schooling areas .
4. Competition numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.

STABLING & FACILITY INFORMATION

1. Stabling is mandatory. The stabling fee includes bedding of shavings. You will be responsible for bedding your own stall. Please remember your wheelbarrow.
2. Once a horse has been checked in at the show office, it may not under any circumstances leave the grounds until after the completion of its class and checking out at the show office. Failure to comply will result in disqualification.
3. Stabling will be open at 11:00am on Wednesday, September 14. Please do not plan your arrival before this time – your horse will have to remain in the trailer until the stabling opens. The show office will open at **1:00pm** for check in.
4. Stabling is available for long distance competitors for Tuesday and Sunday evenings. The fee is \$40/night and must be paid for and indicated on the entry form. Any long distance competitors wishing to arrive in Red Deer before Tuesday may contact Sheri for help in arranging stabling in the area.
5. RVs may be parked next to the stabling for a fee. You must register at the campground office before parking. Please follow directions for parking. There is a campground available on the Westerner grounds. Please call 403-352-8801 to reserve a spot. Anyone camping around the barns in their trailers is subject to the fee and may be ticketed if you don't pay.
6. A wash rack will be available throughout the competition.
7. Absolutely no smoking in the stabling area or indoor arenas.
8. Lunging: Every effort will be made to provide a designated lunging area if space permits. If space does not allow for a designated lunging area then we will try to have designated lunging times posted. There will be no lunging in warm up areas when riders are schooling. (E7.16.6) *As per 7.16.7. Show organizers are not obliged to provide lunging space.*

RIDE TIMES

Ride times will be posted on the ADA website (www.albertadressage.com) on Monday, September 12. You may call on Tuesday, September 13 between 6:00pm and 9:00pm for times as well – 403-358-6605. **Day sheets will be posted each evening at the scoreboards.** Riders are responsible for checking your times each day as changes may be made.

WINE & CHEESE TICKETS

Each horse will receive two tickets in their show package. Additional tickets may be purchased from the show office for \$5 each. Entry to the gala entertainment is free; tickets are only required for the wine & cheese buffet. Reserve tables at the gala may be purchased for \$400 and will seat 8-10 people. This includes ringside seating, a program for the table, information on dressage and the wine & cheese buffet.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentation schedules will be posted near the show office and at the score board. There will be several group presentations throughout the weekend. Please check the schedule carefully. Some presentations will be mounted, some will be un-mounted but in full dress. Some classes will not have presentations and awards can be picked up with your test. Please check this schedule carefully to determine what is required. Riders not present or not correctly turned out will forfeit all prizes and awards. No exceptions!!

HOST HOTEL

Our host hotel is the Sandman Hotel Red Deer. You can call **1-800-SANDMAN** to make reservations. Ask for the Parkland Dressage Festival rate – it is \$99 per night. This is a very busy hotel and it is first come, first serve so reserve early. The Sandman Hotel is a beautiful newer hotel with an onsite Moxie's Restaurant and an adjacent Denny's. It is located just a few minutes from the Westerner. Please consider booking into the Sandman as they have very generously sponsored a portion of our official's hotel bill and are also providing an additional rebate to our show for every room booked by our competitors. This kind of sponsorship allows us to continue to offer a top quality show with excellent prize money.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The Nadeem Ayoob Memorial Award - \$500 and an embroidered cooler presented to the high score freestyle from the Festival

The Irene Hill Memorial Award - \$1000 and an engraved leather halter to be presented to the Youth rider under 19 years of age with the combined highest score (excluding freestyles) from the Provincial Championships and a single Gold show in 2011. Please send in a copy of your best technical test from 2011 with Irene Hill Memorial Award written across the top to apply for this award.

BREED AWARDS

Please send in a copy of your horse's registration papers with your entry to be eligible. You are only eligible for one breed award. To be eligible just send in your papers and if there is an award for your breed, you will be entered.

EVENTS DURING THE WEEKEND

Saturday evening will be the Duckering's International & Wealth Design Group Inc Gala Evening. Please plan to join us for a wine & cheese buffet, fantastic freestyles and entertainment.

We will be once again hosting our dog and cat costume/trick class during the gala evening of musical freestyles on Saturday. You must make your entry at the show office. Please write a brief intro on your pet and their unique talent or outfit. We will be inviting our esteemed international judges to award this event so come out and join us for a very fun time!

In the mornings enjoy hot chocolate or coffee in the barns courtesy of Aspelund Ridge. Helps to get your morning started right!

The Farewell Breakfast will be Sunday morning again this year. Come and join us for pancakes and sausage to get the final day going.

There will be various award boxes located at the show office. Please be sure to enter for the different awards on offer or put your vote in. We will be looking for our vintage rider, youngest rider, vintage horse, the competitor who had the longest drive, hardest working groom, sportsmanship and other awards.
